

## EMAC POSTER SESSION

The EMAC 2026 poster session will take place on Thursday, June 4, from 5:00 – 6:30 PM. The list of accepted and registered posters will be available before the conference through the conference app and programme.

### Guidelines for Preparing your Poster Presentation

- Presenters will interact with attendees while standing next to their poster presentation in the poster exhibition space.
- Attendees at Poster Presentations will stroll by looking for topics of interest.
- Presenters need to attract attention with a visually interesting presentation.
- Organisation and clarity are critical.
- A poster presentation should attract people's interest as they walk by and then be easily reviewed to stimulate a one-to-one discussion with the presenters.
- The goal is to encourage informed discussion about your research.
- The poster should be easily readable from 1.5 meters (4 feet) away.
- One or more of the authors must be present during the session.
- If one author represents a team who wrote the paper, that person should be capable of responding to questions concerning all aspects of the presentation.

### Format:

There will also be other authors presenting their posters in the exhibition space.

You will have one poster board available for your presentation. Your poster should be in A1 format with dimensions of 59.4cm width and 84.1cm height.

Type of letter, font and size:

### We recommend using the following font and font size:

- **Type of font:** Arial
- **Title:** At least 36 points.
- **Headings:** 30 points or more.
- **Text:** At least 24 points.

### Support:

- The organising committee will take care of printing your poster. Please send your accepted poster before 27 April 2026, to [emac2026@bath.ac.uk](mailto:emac2026@bath.ac.uk), indicating the acceptance ID.
- The organising committee will position the poster on the designated supports; however, presenters are responsible for verifying before the session that their poster is correctly placed.
- In case of any issues, presenters should contact the organising team through the organiser's inbox.

### Other recommendations:

When choosing a background to frame your visual presentation, remember that neutral or greyish colours will be easier to see than a bright colour.

Space your information proportionately.

A suggestion is to divide your presentation either horizontally or vertically into three or four sections, and place materials within those sections.

We recommend you use illustrations, schemas and graphics so that your presentation can be more attractive.
